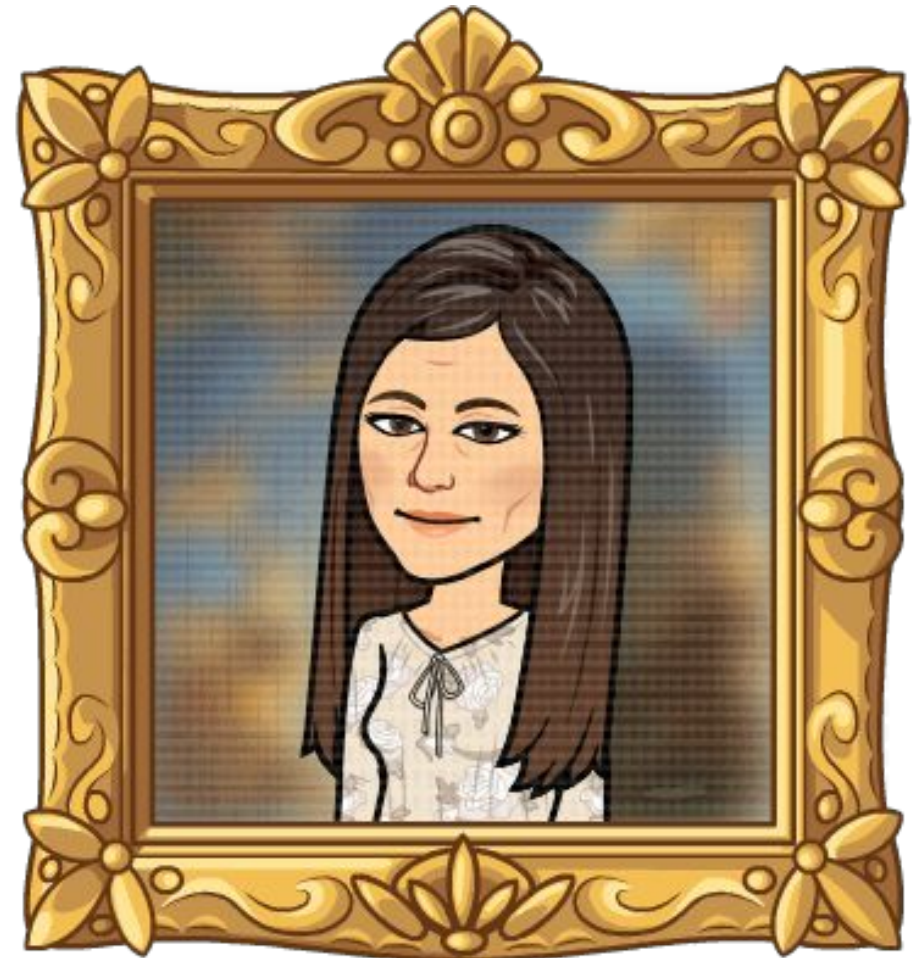

- I am a lifelong learner and hope to spark that love of learning in each of my students.

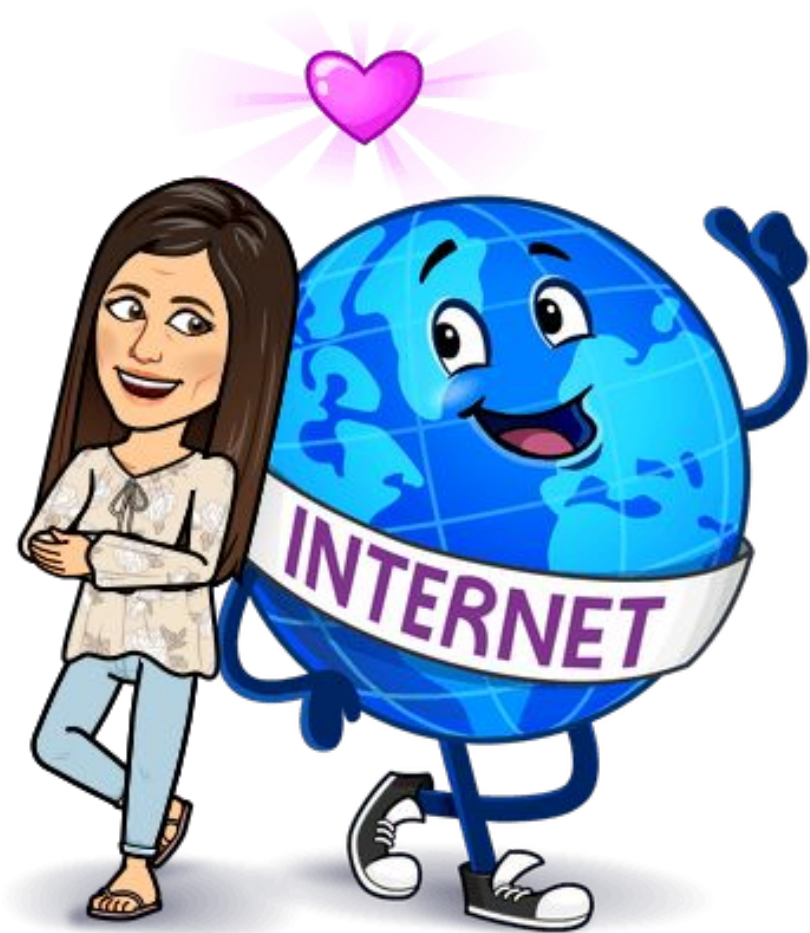

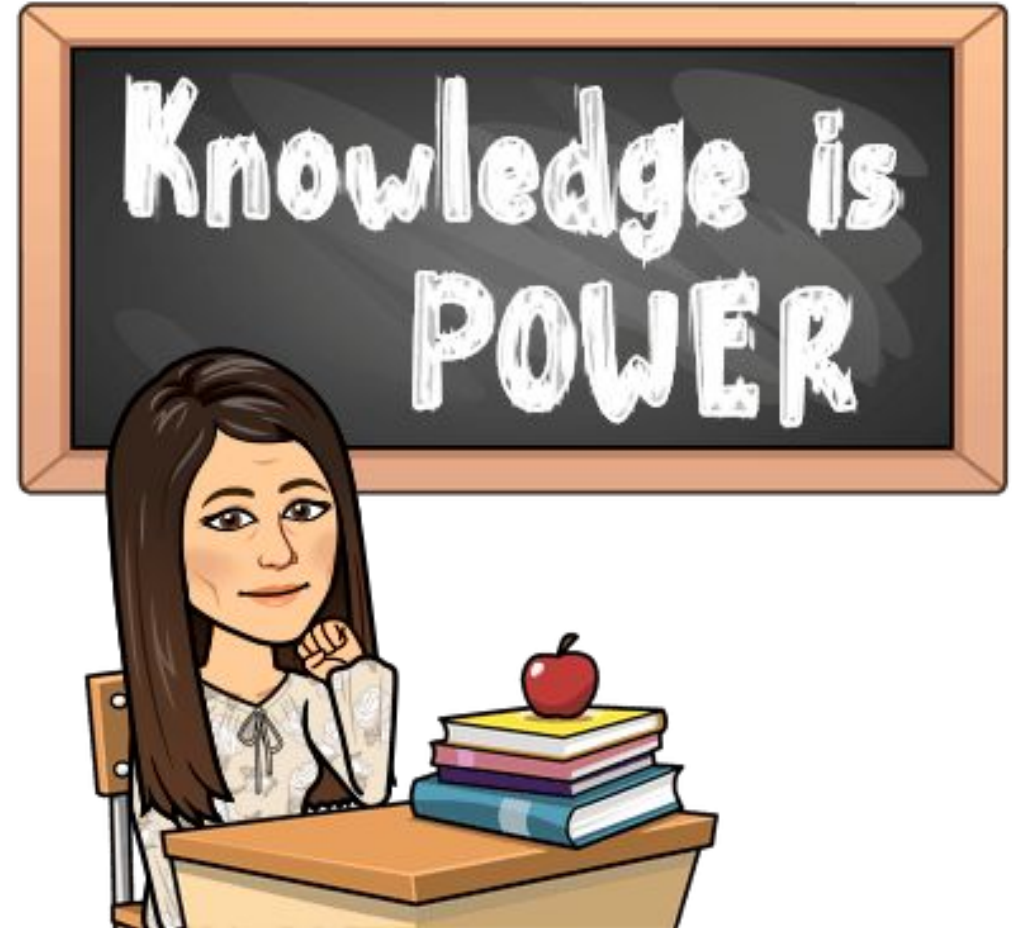

- If your work is completed, your child can read for 20 minutes and practice math facts.

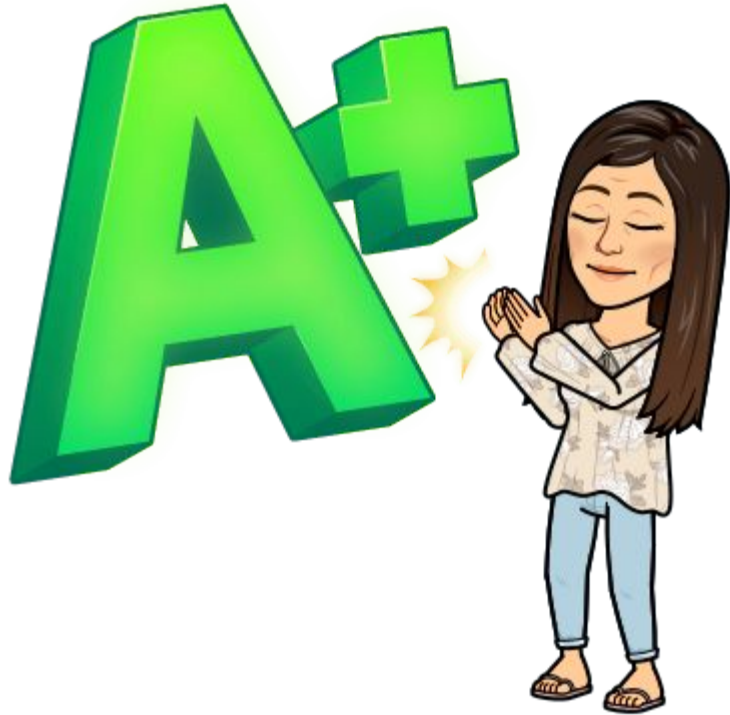


# Classwork

- If your student has submit an assignment and it is returned with feedback, they have an opportunity and are expected to make changes and re-submit for a final grade.



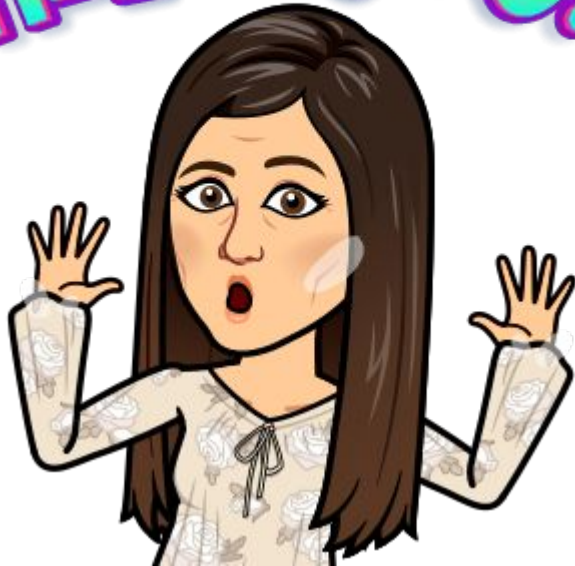
# Grading Guidelines

- All assignments will be reviewed by the teacher. However, not all assignments will receive a final score.

# Late Work Policy

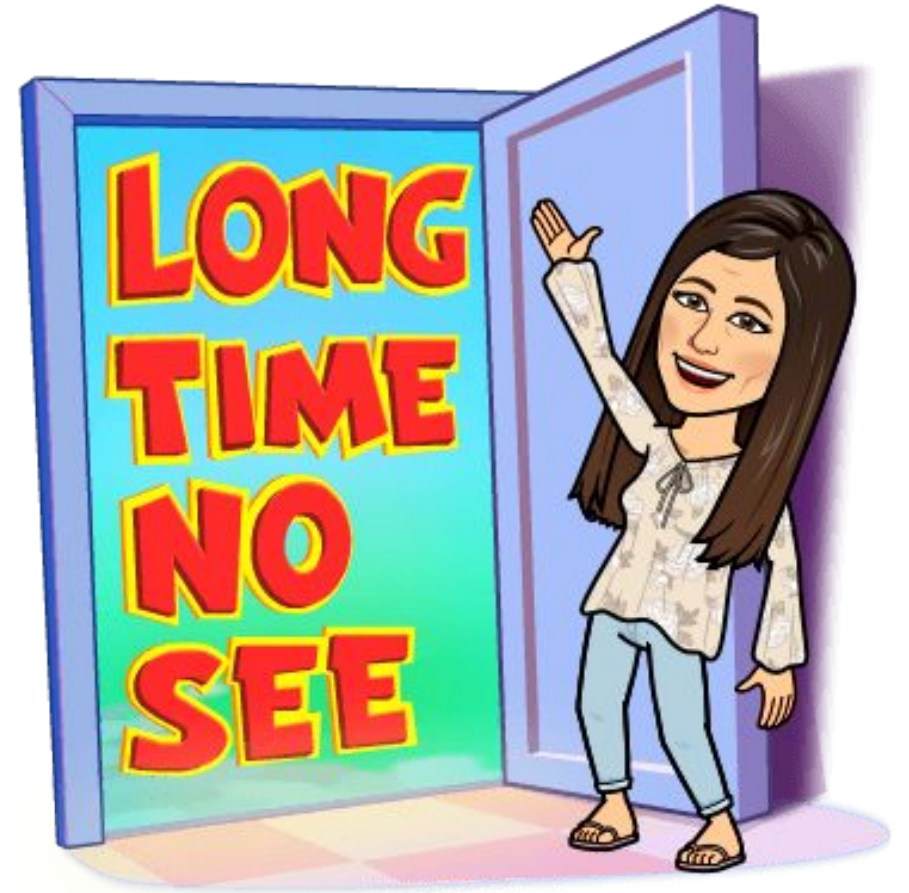
# Attendance

# Google Meet Expectations

- Make sure you are dressed appropriately and ready for online learning.
- Eat before or after your online meetings.
- Be respectful of others ideas and feelings.

- Students will have a full day of rigorous learning and will need to follow the schedule for learning sessions in order to keep up.

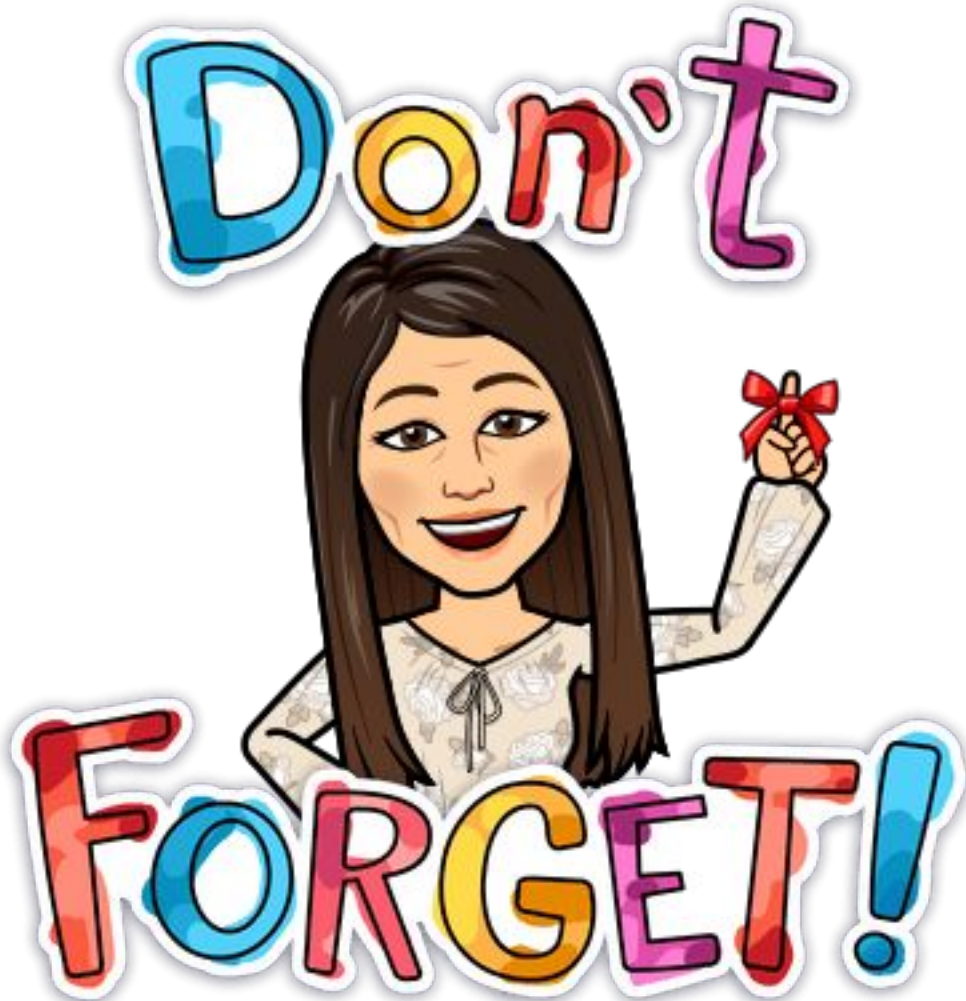
